The School of Educational Studies seeks applications or nominations for two faculty positions in School Administration to serve the Educational Leadership Program. Both positions are full-time, tenure-track with an academic year appointment (9 months) at the indicated rank. Appointments will be effective August 2010, or earlier. Screening of applicants begins October 12, 2009, and will continue until the positions are filled.

**The Brock Endowed Professorship: Open Rank - Professor/Associate, or Assistant School**

**Administration:** In addition to teaching graduate courses and pursuing an active research agenda, the successful candidate is expected to maintain active relationships with teachers and administrators in the field with particular emphasis in the Tulsa metro area, support recruiting efforts for the program, serve on graduate student committees, advise students, participate in curriculum development, engage in service activities, seek external grants/contracts, and maintain a visible role in educational administration organizations and associations. Candidates should have an interest in urban schools with expertise in one or more of the following areas: instructional supervision and staff development, policy and politics, research methods, organizational theory, school law, finance, business administration, educational technology and district resource planning.

**Assistant Professor, School Administration:** Although located on the OSU-Stillwater campus, the successful candidate will also serve the program's needs on the OSU-Tulsa campus and in the Oklahoma City area. The successful candidate will be expected to teach graduate courses and maintain an active research agenda. The candidate will also be expected to maintain active relationships with teachers and administrators in the field, support recruiting efforts for the program, serve on graduate student committees, advise students, participate in curriculum development, engage in service activities, seek external grants/contracts, and maintain a visible role in educational administration organizations and associations. Candidates should have expertise in one or more of the following areas: instructional supervision and staff development, policy and politics, research methods, organizational theory, school law, finance, business administration, educational technology and district resource planning.

**Qualifications Required:** An earned doctorate in school administration or a related field is required. P-12 teaching and administrative experience are preferred. The successful candidate should demonstrate an area of inquiry that can lead to a record of research and publication.
