Proposal Format

Please, submit your proposal as a Microsoft Word Attachment to an email. All information must be included for consideration.

Cover Page

1. Title of Session: Limit of 15 words
2. Speakers: Each speaker should include the following:
Name and Credentials; Address; Work Phone; Fax; E-mail
3. Professional Vitae for Each Speaker: *Three-page maximum*, highlighting subject matter competency
4. References: Include two references for each speaker that can verify subject matter competency

Page 2: Session Proposal.

1. Title of Session: Limit of 15 words
2. Brief Description of Program: Limit of 35 words
3. Learning Outcomes: Outcomes must be measurable and indicate what the audience will learn by participating in this session. e.g. Participants will be able to...
4. Identified focus area (see first page)
5. Outline of Session: Content & Methodology
6. Mode of Presentation: **Individual/Group Presentation with work group**
7. Resource List: Provide a list of books/journal articles related to your topic
8. Indicate the appropriate NCTRC Job Analysis Code (refer to Updated 2007 NCTRC Exam Content Outline).
