COLLEGE-WIDE SCHOLARSHIPS

DR. JOAN BAIRD SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time junior or senior in the College of Human Environmental Sciences who has shown professional orientation and commitment to the College.

BUCK AND IRENE CLEMENTS SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time undergraduate or graduate student, majoring in any area in CHES, 2.5 minimum GPA, financial need.

BRYAN CLOSE TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: The recipient(s) must be full-time students enrolled in the College of Human Environmental Sciences at Oklahoma State University. The recipients must be transferring into OSU from a college or university in Oklahoma, with preference given to students from Tulsa County, who exhibit strong financial need. First preference shall also be given to students who are working while attending OSU. The recipient must have a minimum 2.5 grade point average. The scholarship may be renewed, provided the student(s) continue to demonstrate financial need and have maintained a grade point average that will allow progression toward graduation.

COLLEGE OF HUMAN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES ASSOCIATES SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Enrolled as a full-time student in CHES. Award will be given to undergraduates during their internship experiences. Recipient must have a minimum of 3.0 GPA and preference shall be given to a student who exhibits financial need.

COLLEGE OF HUMAN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: ACT above 22, High School GPA above 3.25, demonstrate leadership abilities, interest in a CHES major.

COLLEGE OF HUMAN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES INTERNSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Must meet minimum departmental requirements for participation in an internship. Must have the ability to represent OSU and CHES in the capacity of a professional. Retention GPA and Major GPA will be considered.

COLLEGE OF HUMAN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Must be transferring from another college or university to OSU in the fall. Must be a CHES major, GPA will be considered.

COLLEGE OF HUMAN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES DESIGN EXPRESS SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Event participation, admissible to OSU. Other qualifications determined by the scholarship committee.

COLLEGE OF HUMAN ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES NUTRITION EXPO SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Event participation, admissible to OSU. Other qualifications determined by the scholarship committee.

DR. LORA CACY SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Determined by CHES scholarship committee.

EMMA CHANDLER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Sophomore, junior or senior (should have completed at least one year of academic work at an institution of higher education in Oklahoma), female student enrolled full-time in CHES; high academic standing; need will be considered.

CLEO L. CRAIG FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: To be determined by the College.

NANCY PAYNE ELLIS SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Must be full-time undergraduate student in CHES at OSU; the recipient may reapply to receive the scholarship as long as he/she is classified as a full-time undergraduate student. Strong consideration given to a student exhibiting financial need; the student must also demonstrate leadership ability as well as school and community involvement; the student should demonstrate the ability to give back to the community.

HUGH S. AND MARY E. EMERSON SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time student in CHES.

FAMILY, CAREER AND COMMUNITY LEADERS OF AMERICA SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Applicants must be a FCCLA member in the state of Oklahoma and be fully admissible to Oklahoma State University. Applicants must be planning to major in one of the programs offered in the College of Human Environmental Sciences. Contact H. S. FCCLA advisor for application.

JAMES R. AND MARIE FLEMING SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Senior or Graduate student, full-time in CHES, demonstrated professional potential, high scholastic record, financial need not important, may be renewed.

DEBORAH LLOYD FORREST INTERNSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: To be determined by the College.

GREEN COUNTRY HOME ECONOMISTS OF TULSA SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Student should be a junior or senior in the College of Human Environmental Sciences for the school year in which the scholarship is given. Student should be from Tulsa or its metropolitan area. In the past, this has included Broken Arrow, Bixby, Jenks, Sapulpa, Liberty, Mounds, Glenpool, Sand Springs, Skiatook, Berryhill, Owasso, Catoosa, Claremore, Collinsville, and Sperry, along with Tulsa.

BESSIE LOUISE (MANN) HAUG SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: CHES full-time student.

Qualifications: Undergraduate, full-time student in CHES; Oklahoma resident with high ideals and moral principals; financial need is first consideration along with leadership, diligent work habits, genuine interest in a college education, personality, ability to get along with others and ability to manage money wisely.

BEULAH MAE KINNEY ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Sophomore, junior, or senior student; good academic standing; active in CHES and university activities.

JAN MORAN LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: CHES Outstanding Student is recipient.

LETITIA OLSON CANDLE SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: GPA 3.0, full-time CHES student, member of Phi Upsilon Omicron, potential for leadership, and must contribute substantially to this organization.

KAPPA OMICRON NU FORMER ADVISORS SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Undergraduate: Freshman student(s) with the highest GPA their first semester at OSU. Graduate: Student is selected on the basis of their scholarship, professional goals and potential for contribution to Family and Consumer Sciences.

LEEVEA PEPIN SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: CHES full-time student, junior preferred, 3.0 GPA, financial need.

KNOLAND JAMES AND CAROLYN RUTH PLUCKNETT SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: CHES full-time student.

MARGARET I. KIMES SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Enrolled as a full-time student in CHES, minimum GPA of 3.0; primary consideration will be given to those students exhibiting financial need, with preference given to a student who is a single parent, or non-traditional/older student. The recipient may reapply to continue receiving the scholarship.

MARY G. LAWRENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Students with financial need enrolled in CHES major; academic achievement and involvement in University student organizations to be considered.

LINDA LUCYL LEWIS SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Rural Oklahoma student, CHES major, minimum GPA 3.0, need is a factor, consideration given to demonstrated leadership.

FLORENCE E. MCKINNEY ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: CHES full-time undergraduate student.

OKLAHOMA COUNTY COMMUNITY EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Sophomore, Junior or Senior, minimum GPA of 3.0, Oklahoma resident.

OKLAHOMA EXTENSION ASSOCIATION FOR FAMILY AND CONSUMER SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Junior standing, 2.5 GPA, 4H experience or expressed interest in extension career. Financial need and work while attending college.

LELA O'TOOLE ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Junior or senior student; good academic standing; active in CHES and University student organizations, minimum GPA 3.0.

PHI U NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Be a member in good standing of Phi Upsilon Omicron. Be enrolled in a college/university degree program for one academic quarter/semester following submission of application.

MILDRED H. AND JOHN W. SKINNER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: CHES major; full-time student; demonstrated outstanding scholastic ability; preference to sophomore, junior or senior; based on satisfactory academic progress; recipients are eligible to receive scholarship for more than one year; all other qualifications being equal, financial need may be considered (need is not a factor); well defined professional goals.

BONNIE E. SMITH SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time undergraduate student in CHES, minimum GPA of 3.0, first preference given to a student exhibiting financial need. Preference given to a student who is a single parent or nontraditional/older student.

NORA TALBOT ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Sophomore student, good academic standing, active in CHES and University student organizations, minimum 3.0 GPA.

ROLLIN H. AND RUTH M. THAYER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: To be determined by the scholarship committee.

DESIGN, HOUSING, AND MERCHANDISING

REGINA BRINKERHOFF SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Junior or Senior, 3.0 minimum GPA; Apparel Design or Merchandising major; active in AMDA; participation in CHES and University activities.

WILMA HEERS CHRISTIANSEN DESIGN SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time student at OSU pursuing a degree in Interior Design or Apparel Design. Must have earned a minimum 3.50 GPA in the major field of study; must have a 3.0 overall GPA. A portfolio is also required.

INTERNATIONAL FACILITY MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION – OKLAHOMA CITY CHAPTER

Qualifications: Interior Design Junior with emphasis in Facility Management.

INTERNATIONAL FACILITIES MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION – TULSA CHAPTER

Qualifications: Must have at least a 3.0 GPA. Must be a junior or above at time of application. Graduate students are also eligible. Must be an IFMA member but does not have to be an interior design major. Students should submit a resume. Student should describe in writing: contributions to IFMA, why they are interested in facility management as a career, their career goals after graduation, and facility management courses or seminars attended. Must be from Green Country.

KAREN MARIE LAUFFENBURGER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time Interior Design student entering Sophomore year; financial need and strong desire to achieve a career in interior design shall be prime criteria for selection. (NOTE: Candidates must submit a written essay stating why they chose to pursue a career in interior design and a statement concerning their need for financial assistance.) Academic achievement is a less important factor. Recipient shall correspond with the donor to advise of academic progress.

SARA MEADOR SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Graduate or undergraduate, full-time student enrolled in DHM; preference to person working in historic costume; preferred that recipient be a single parent and non-panhellenic. First preference given to applicants meeting all stated qualifications; high academic standing.

JEAN BULLEN NEWMAN INTERNSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Applicants must meet minimum departmental requirements for participation in a DHM internship and must have the ability to represent OSU and the College of Human Environmental Sciences in the capacity of a professional. GPA and financial need for completing the internship will be considered.

MILTON PASCHALL SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Junior or Senior, full-time student in interior design, 3.0 minimum GPA in major courses; one semester in residence at OSU; demonstrated interest in interior design activities; indication of professional potential and attitude of sincere interest and enthusiasm.

FAMILY RELATIONS AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT

LORENE WULZ KEELER-BATTLES ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Junior FRCD student majoring in gerontology; 3.0 minimum GPA; exhibit a professional potential in gerontology.

D.A. (PUG) AND MARY GRIFFIN DAUGHTERS SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Junior; full-time student at OSU majoring in FRCD; maintained overall GPA of 2.5 or better through 5 semesters of study; need will be prime consideration with character and leadership also considered.

DR. JOSEPHINE HOFFER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: FRCD graduating senior in teacher education. Success of student in FRCD student teaching program should be given strong consideration. Recipient should plan to teach and show professionalism, leadership potential, and maturity. Students should be nominated by faculty with final selection made by a panel.

LUCY E. HOWLAND SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time student in CHES; must be pursuing a degree in Early Childhood Education; be a sophomore, junior, senior, or first-year Master's student. First consideration given to academics with financial need being considered secondary.

DR. VIRGINIA STAPLEY FRCD SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Graduate student pursuing an advanced degree in FRCD.

FRANCES PEUGNET SWANSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time student enrolled at OSU-Stillwater or OSU-Tulsa. Minimum 3.0 GPA. Junior or Senior undergraduate student or a graduate student pursuing a degree in early childhood education and/or special education as related to early childhood education. Preference to be given to a student with a learning disability.

GRADUATE

BUCK AND IRENE CLEMENTS SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time graduate student, majoring in any area in CHES, 2.5 minimum GPA, financial need.

JORGENSEN ENDOWMENT FUND/SCHOLARSHIP & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Qualifications: E.L. and Argot Jorgenson Scholarship: 1) A doctoral candidate with major emphasis in Family Relations and Child Development, must have completed 30 hours beyond the master's degree and have completed the qualifying examination for a doctoral for a doctoral study satisfactorily. 2) A doctoral candidate with major emphasis in child development or early childhood education, must have completed 30 hours of study beyond a master's degree and has satisfactorily passed the required qualifying examination, or 3) a master's degree student with emphasis in child development or early childhood education who plans to teach, which has completed at least half of the master's degree program and has an approved research plan on file with major adviser. Funds are to assist in completion of dissertation/thesis. A recommendation from each applicant's major advisor will be required when applying for the award and the application should include a statement about applicant's professional goals.

MARGUERITE SCRUGGS RESEARCH ENRICHMENT FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Graduate student who is working on thesis and/or dissertation.

MILDRED H. AND JOHN W. SKINNER GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Student working toward graduate degree in College of CHES; demonstrated outstanding scholastic ability and academic achievement; all other qualifications being equal, financial need may be considered. May be given for more than one year.

JOSEPH AND LOUISE C. WEBER GERONTOLOGY FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time masters or doctoral student in CHES, emphasis in gerontology; demonstrate potential for scholastic excellence, preference given to student in FRCD.

KARL AND LOUISE WOLF GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Preference given to CHES graduate student (Junior or Senior may be considered if no qualified graduate student applies); 3.0 minimum GPA; worthy professional goals; good character; need is secondary consideration.

BURTON W. AND GLADYS T. LOGUE FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Graduate student (preference is given to graduate students, however, if that is not possible then the scholarship is to be awarded to a junior or senior in the college); American citizen; Oklahoma resident; high academic achievement; working part-time.

HOTEL AND RESTAURANT ADMINISTRATION

AMERICAN HOTEL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Funds are allocated by the American Hotel Foundation from the Conrad Hilton Memorial Fund.

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time, minimum of twelve hours in the fall and spring semesters (students graduating in December can be nominated through a special process). Recipients must have completed their sophomore year with a minimum overall GPA of 2.00 and be a U. S. citizen or permanent resident. The scholarship can be received in subsequent years. The HRA Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

JIM L. ANDERSON SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration, participation in High School Vo-Tech Food Service Programs or the DECA / VICA program with experience in the hospitality field. The Oklahoma Restaurant Association Education Committee makes selection.

JEAN ARMANTROUT - LEONARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration. First preference given to applicants who are freshmen. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

EASTMAN AUTO-CHLOR SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Oklahoma resident, financial need, and recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

BAKER BOKORNEY SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipient must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration. This scholarship is awarded to the executive Chair of Hospitality Days. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

RICHARD J. BREWER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration with a minimum overall GPA of 2.50. The award is made to a junior or senior who demonstrates a dedication to the hotel and restaurant industry; has a financial need; and is working full or part-time in a hotel, motel, restaurant or related industry to help cover the cost of his/her education. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

DISTINGUISHED CHEF SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Work experience and completion of a written report for each Chef Event during a semester. Awards are made in the fall and spring based on the work experience and report from the previous semester. The HRAD faculty and staff evaluate the applications and award the scholarships.

ANDY JOHNSON SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time freshman student in the School of Hotel and Restaurant Administration. Recipient may retain the scholarship for up to four years, provided he/she maintains a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA and a minimum 2.5 GPA in his/her major field of study.

BRIAN MACARTHUR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time undergraduate student in the School of Hotel and Restaurant Administration; minimum 3.0 GPA. The scholarship may be awarded to a freshman, sophomore or transfer student and may be renewed for up to three years of undergraduate study, provided the recipient continues to maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA.

JACK E. MILLER SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration. First preference will be given to an Oklahoma resident. Preference shall also be given to a student who has participated in High School Vo-Tech Food Service Programs or the DECA / VICA program, or has experience in the hospitality field. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

BRIE MCKENZIE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration with a minimum overall GPA of 3.00. First preference will be given to an Oklahoma resident. Preference shall also be given to a student who is employed while attending school. The recipient must demonstrate financial need. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

OKLAHOMA RESTAURANT ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Funds are allocated by the Oklahoma Restaurant Association.

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration concentrating on courses that will lead to an emphasis in restaurant management. The recipient must demonstrate a commitment to a career in restaurant management and have outstanding abilities that are adaptable to the industry. An interview with member of the ORA is required as part of the evaluation process. The Oklahoma Restaurant Association Education Committee awards the scholarships.

BILL AND RITA RYAN SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipients will be those students who have been named as the outstanding student in three categories (undergraduate, master, and doctoral) by the faculty in the OSU School of Hotel and Restaurant Administration. Recipients must be graduating, as confirmed by the University, in the semester that they receive the scholarship. Scholarships will be awarded at the end of both the fall and spring semesters. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarships.

BETTYE STRATTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Must be full-time student at OSU; junior or above with a minimum overall GPA of 3.00. Recipient must be working in some function of the hospitality industry; preference will be given to a student working in the Student Union. Financial need is a requirement. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

TULSA METROPLEX HOTEL/MOTEL ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Student must be a resident of the Tulsa area that includes Tulsa, Osage, Rogers, Wagoner, Mayes, Creek, and Okmulgee counties. Applicants must be in their junior or senior year, and have an overall GPA of at least 2.50. Recipients must be enrolled full-time, minimum of twelve hours in the fall and spring semesters at Oklahoma State University, Northeastern State University, or Langston University. Character and personal qualifications, leadership abilities, and need are considered. Recipient must be able to attend the Tulsa Metroplex Hotel/Motel Association Christmas party. The Tulsa Metroplex Hotel/Motel Association Scholarship Committee selects the recipients.

LAURA D. VALENTINE SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum of twelve hours) in the fall and spring semesters in Hotel and Restaurant Administration with a minimum overall GPA of 3.00. The recipient must demonstrate financial need. The HRAD Student Recognition Committee awards the scholarship.

NUTRITIONAL SCIENCES

CATLETT-HAGEMAN GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time student in the Department of Nutritional Sciences at OSU. The recipient must be pursuing a master's or doctoral degree, and must demonstrate an interest or aptitude in research. The recipient must have maintained a minimum 3.25 GPA.

LEANDRO AND ELVIRA EBRO GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Must be enrolled in the Nutritional Sciences Department at OSU, must be pursuing an advanced degree with a major in food service administration/management with a minimum 3.50 GPA in graduate courses. The recipient must be South-east Asian or Native American and must be a registered dietitian (RD) or RD eligible.

MEAD AND MARY FERGUSON NUTRITIONAL SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time student in NSCI at OSU. Preference for NW Oklahoma or Oklahoma residents; completed 2 semesters at OSU with plans to attend at least two additional semesters. Must be eligible for graduation within the next two years. Demonstrated improvement in GPA and in top one-fourth of students in major area of study. Improvement in GPA, leadership ability, and communication skills will be given equal consideration in selection of the scholarship recipient.

MARTHA JOHNSTON SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Nutritional Sciences major preferably with an emphasis in business or journalism.

MARY LEIDIGH GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

Qualifications: Must be enrolled in HES with major in NSCI; dietetic intern, master's or doctoral student with at least one semester of course work or experience. A 3.0 minimum GPA. Evidence of scholastic achievement and financial need.

DR. DAISY I. PURDY AWARD

Qualifications: Selected by students. Student who has made the most outstanding contributions to the Nutritional Sciences Club.

M. B. SERETAN NUTRITIONAL SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time NSCI students who have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester and remain in good standing with OSU with at least a 3.0 GPA. Primary consideration should be given to those students exhibiting financial need.

WINTERFELDT GRADUATE FUND FOR RESEARCH

Qualifications: Selection will be based on need for financial assistance while conducting research or preparing thesis or dissertation; recipient must be Registered Dietitian (R.D.) or R.D. eligible.

H. C. AND LETITIA OLSON PRESIDENT'S DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARSHIP

Qualifications: Full-time Junior NSCI student. Minimum 3.0 GPA. Demonstrated leadership qualities. May be renewed for senior year.
