NONRESIDENT OSU ALUMNI LEGACY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP FOR
UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS (FRESHMEN & TRANSFER)

For 2008-2009 New Students

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- First-time entering nonresident undergraduate students who do not already hold a baccalaureate or higher degree, are fully admissible to OSU in good standing as defined by State Regents' policy, meet the eligibility criteria below, and whose parents or grandparents received a baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degree from OSU (previously Oklahoma A&M College) are eligible. The qualifying parent or grandparent alumnus must have graduated from OSU before the student starts classes at OSU and must hold an OSU baccalaureate or higher degree (associate's degrees and certificates do not qualify).

Freshman Applicants:

- Applicants must be admissible to Oklahoma State University.

Transfer Applicants:

- Applicants with less than 24 college-level credit hours: Applicant must satisfy the freshman applicant requirements and have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA (A=4.0) for all college-level coursework attempted.
- Applicants with 24 or more college-level credit hours: Applicant must have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA (A=4.0) for all college-level coursework attempted.

TO APPLY FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP:

- Submit the Undergraduate Application for Admission/Scholarships 2008-2009 by the priority due date of February 1, 2008.
 - **First priority for scholarship awards is given to those whose applications are received by February 1, 2008.**
 - Applications received after that date will be accepted but may not be eligible for all OSU awards.
 - You must apply and qualify for this scholarship before your first semester at OSU begins.
 - Check the block on the admission/scholarships application that indicates you are a child or grandchild of an OSU alumnus, then complete and return the Nonresident Undergraduate Alumni Legacy Tuition Scholarship Certification Form that will be sent to you.

TO RECEIVE THIS SCHOLARSHIP:

- Accept the scholarship offer and enroll by the time indicated in the University's correspondence.
- Enroll in at least **12 (twelve) credit hours** at OSU during each fall and spring semester for the duration of the award.

TO RETAIN THIS SCHOLARSHIP:

- Earn at least **28 (twenty-eight) credit hours** at OSU each academic year and achieve a minimum **3.0 cumulative graduation/retention GPA** by the end of the spring term each year.
 - If, by the end of the spring term, you do not meet the credit hour/GPA criteria to continue the scholarship, you will be notified by letter of your options for scholarship restoration. You must succeed in restoring your eligibility before the next academic year begins; otherwise your scholarship is lost and cannot be reacquired.

SCHOLARSHIP VALUE & DURATION:

- This scholarship waives up to **\$3,750 per academic year** (\$1,875 per semester) in nonresident tuition. You must pay resident tuition, fees, and any remaining nonresident tuition. **This scholarship cannot be used during summer.**
- This scholarship is valid for a **maximum of 4 years** (8 semesters) of undergraduate study and cannot be extended.
 - Freshmen: The 8 semester limit begins with the student's first enrollment at OSU.
 - Transfers: The number of hours transferred (14 hours=1 semester) determines the number of semesters awarded.
- This scholarship can be used only for the completion of one undergraduate degree. **You must be classified as an undergraduate student**, as defined by the OSU Registrar, to receive it. It will be canceled upon your entry into graduate school.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- Tuition scholarships are granted on a first-come, first-served basis as long as funding remains available.
- This award requires **continuous fall/spring enrollment at OSU** for the duration of the award. If you experience an emergency or wish to leave OSU for a time and retain your scholarship when you return, you must apply for a deferment from the Office of Scholarships & Financial Aid **before you leave**. Deferments are not automatic. You must meet the scholarship retention criteria, including GPA & hours earned (one-half of the required hours if here only one term that year), before you leave to be eligible for a deferment. **Attending any other college or university while on deferment will result in the loss of the scholarship**, although some accommodation may be made for OSU-related programs (e.g., OSU-sponsored study abroad programs).
